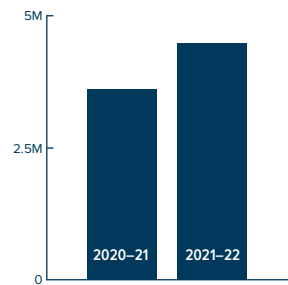

Moody Alumni: Sharing Christ in the Midst of War

Russia’s military invaded Ukraine on February 24, 2022, sparking the most brutal war the world has witnessed in decades. That same evening, graduates of Moody Bible Institute immediately began serving Ukrainian families evacuating their homeland, pointing them to Jesus Christ.



Adelina Ghilea, a 2015 Moody graduate, joined a grassroots network of volunteers helping Ukrainians find safe passage into Romania and

support for transitioning to live in other European countries. Sergey Rakhuba, a 1995 graduate, mobilized his Mission Eurasia ministry to provide humanitarian aid and distribute gospel tracts and Bibles throughout Ukraine and other Eastern European nations.



Emily Rudolph, a 2002 graduate, and her family had to flee Ukraine, where she was teaching at a Christian school in Kyiv, just before the war erupted.

Since arriving in Poland, Emily and her husband have volunteered as refugees

servicing the needs of other Ukrainian refugees, including sharing their testimony and the gospel.



Matthew Snyder, a 2013 graduate and Moody instructor, traveled with his wife from Chicago to spend spring break distributing critical

supplies and supporting Ukrainians in Eastern Europe and Western Ukraine.



Claire Patty, a 2016 graduate, has shared the love and hope of Christ with dozens of Ukrainian refugee moms and their children in the Czech

Republic as kids director of Josiah Venture, a church-planting ministry.

As they serve refugees whose lives have been thrown into chaos, our alumni lovingly and intentionally present the gospel as often as they can. Their zeal for sharing Christ was nurtured as students at Moody. “It was in the DNA of the school,” Emily Rudolph said. “We all had the same purpose of glorifying God and serving Him with our lives.”



Moody Radio and *Today in the Word*: A Bold Step into Africa

In January 2022 the Moody Radio weekday program *Bold Steps* with Dr. Mark Jobe entered a partnership with Far East Broadcasting Company to broadcast twice a day on stations in Malawi, Mozambique, and Tanzania. Moody Radio's first international release is now airing the gospel message in a region representing over three million listeners, specifically the unreached Yao Muslims.

Yao Muslims have traditionally resisted church planting and other outreach

efforts, but today they are hearing and responding to the gospel like never before. Personal testimonies of their newfound faith in Christ pour in to Moody Radio nearly every week.

When I started listening to *Bold Steps*, I found the right way to God through the gospel.

"I used to hate Christians. I even called them the enemies of Islam," said Fasilu,

a former Yao Muslim. "However, when I started listening to *Bold Steps* I found the right way to God through the gospel. It has mended my life to Jesus, the One I used to hate before."

Building on this partnership, Moody and FEBC began translating and broadcasting the *Today in the Word* audio program in the Chiyao language in Malawi. "This really encompasses Moody's goal for the 2030 vision of doubling our impact," said Judy Kron, *Bold Step's* executive producer.

Moody Alumni: Taking the Good News to Restricted Regions

Moody teaches students to follow God's call on their lives wherever He leads, including countries where Christianity faces serious restrictions.

Wayne,* a 2021 Moody graduate, is a missionary who shares Christ predominantly with Muslim students through a campus outreach and a conversational English class in a Middle Eastern country.

"Moody is a great place to learn and do ministry," Wayne said. "The ministry training we received (in Practical Christian Ministries) was the most fruitful and beneficial part of my experience at Moody."

After graduating from Moody Bible Institute in 2017, Josh and Hillary followed God's lead to serve as missionaries in Cambodia, where less than one percent of residents are professed Christians. From distributing children's Bibles and presenting the gospel in after-school programs to witnessing in villages throughout the country, Josh and Hillary want to be used by God to reach as many Cambodians as possible.

Moody Alumni: Helping the Most Vulnerable Meet Jesus

From helping women caught in the dark pit of sex trafficking to assisting struggling families in under-resourced communities, our alumni are sharing the love and hope of Christ in the Chicago area.

Simone Halpin, a 2008 graduate of Moody Theological Seminary, serves as executive director of Naomi's House, a residential ministry for women trapped in commercial sexual exploitation. This past year, the number of women who

have completed the Chicago residential program grew to 13, and the ministry expanded to launch a day residence program in Chicago's suburbs.

Simone credits Moody with equipping her to introduce women to Jesus Christ, disciple them from God's Word, and integrate them into a Christ-centered community. "I specifically learned so much about urban ministry at Moody," Simone said.

In Chicago's Little Village neighborhood, Matt DeMateo, pastor and executive director at New Life Centers and a 2003 Moody graduate, unveiled Pan De Vida, a new full-time food distribution facility that began supporting the surrounding under-resourced community on June 13. Pan De Vida provides free groceries for families and connections to community and resources, including a state-of-the-art computer lab, an after-school homework program, and a job training mentor program.

The ultimate mission of Pan De Vida's services is to lead youth and families to Christ, the Bread of Life. (Pan De Vida means Bread of Life.)



Unlikely Friends Write New Book on Witnessing

Craig Cooper and Walker Hayes were about as diametrically opposite as two men could be. Craig was a pastor in Franklin, Tennessee, and Walker was an atheist struggling with alcoholism and a failing country music career.



Craig and Walker forged an unlikely friendship through their kids' athletic involvement. By demonstrating God's love, Craig shattered Walker's misconceptions of Christianity. Walker eventually surrendered his life to Christ, and the two men grew so close that their families became next-door neighbors. They even tore down the fence separating their backyards, symbolizing the gospel's power to remove barriers and unite us in Christ.

Last year Craig and Walker collaborated to write a book, *Glad You're Here*, based on their relationship. Released by Moody Publishers, *Glad You're Here* has already sold over 60,000 copies and led to interviews with national media outlets. The book reveals how the gospel can transform people through the gift of friendship and how God can equip us to be His witnesses in a broken world.

"My greatest desire is that Jesus would be exalted through this story we've told," Craig Cooper said. "May this book be used by God as a catalyst for revival in the souls of believers and unbelievers alike all over the world. I'm praying that it strengthens the church and advances the gospel for the glory of Jesus Christ!"

75 Years of Training Mission Aviators

In 2021–22 Moody Aviation celebrated its 75th year of preparing pilots, mechanics, and avionics technicians to advance the gospel around the globe. It is the world's first and oldest school devoted to training missionary pilots in pursuit of the Great Commission. Since 1946, our alumni have poured their lives into mission and humanitarian relief work with over 110 mission organizations in more than 60 countries.

Since Moody Aviation's founding, roughly 1,000 students have graduated as pilots and maintenance specialists. More than 70 percent of graduates have served with missionary-sending agencies, accounting for nearly half of all pilots and mechanics for Mission Aviation Fellowship and JAARS. Our graduates' dedication enables Bible translation, church planting, disaster relief, emergency aid, and transportation that delivers the good news of Christ to the most remote regions of the world.

“Those who are called to share in the exciting work of mission aviation look forward to watching the light of Christ

dawn in dark places,” said Cecil Bedford, Moody Aviation professor emeritus. “They help the news of His love reach the ends of the earth for the very first time.”

PCMs: Preparing Students to Reach the World

Practical Christian Ministries (PCM) is a longstanding program at Moody Bible Institute that many alumni and current students say is the most important factor in their development at Moody. Serving at ministries throughout Chicago each week, students deepen their faith, stretch their hearts and skills for serving, prepare for life and ministry after graduation, and influence others for Christ in a real-world urban context.

Moody PCMs worked in concert with

234 different churches and agencies in Chicago, ranging from Pacific Garden Mission (homeless ministry) and Exodus World Service (kids club for Afghan refugee children) to Sabka Sahaara (church ministering to refugee families) and ASHA Outreach (restoring women caught in sex trafficking).

“I came to Moody because of PCMs,” said Emily Taylor, a senior at Moody who tutors children with a PCM at the South Asian Friendship Center. “I just

love the idea of meeting the tangible needs of the community while sharing the love and hope of Jesus.”

Sometimes students witness the fruit of their seed-sowing at PCMs. Over 100 people surrendered their lives to Christ in 2021–22 as a direct result of PCMs, including a woman enrolled in an English as a Second Language class run by a PCM. “Peiwen gave her life to Jesus!” said Jane, a senior at Moody. “Praise God! I have been praying for this!”

New Degree Programs Expand Gospel Reach

Starting this year, Moody is offering three new associate and certificate programs that will train students to communicate the gospel and instill biblical truth among diverse people groups.

The Children and Family Ministry program prepares students to share the gospel and teach and disciple kids and parents in a range of ministry settings, from churches and orphanages to after-school programs. The Intercultural Studies program equips students to proclaim the gospel and serve the global church across a variety of cultural boundaries as a missionary, church planter, ministry leader to immigrants and refugees, and a range of other roles. Both programs offer bachelor’s, associate’s, and undergraduate certificate degree options.

The undergraduate Certificate in Disability Ministry is for students with a heart for those with disabilities and the people charged with their care. Featuring online and on-campus options, the program teaches how to serve and share God’s love in churches, camp and parachurch ministries, social service work, and high schools and colleges.

More Students Learning Online Than Ever

Moody’s online programs allow students anywhere in the world to graduate with a master’s, bachelor’s, or associate’s degree or certificate while training them for God’s unique purpose for their lives. Students can also participate in our hyflex model, providing the flexibility of viewing courses live on Zoom or watching a recorded version at a later time.

Living with his wife and two boys in Wasilla, Alaska, 2,200 miles from Moody’s Chicago campus, Adrian Ortiz graduated from Moody with a BS in Biblical Studies in 2021 after taking courses online for four years. He was hired by an Alaskan church as its full-time youth pastor, fulfilling a dream God placed on his heart several years earlier.

“Those four years in Moody’s online program were so important,” Adrian says. “My training and understanding of Scripture and the tools I gained for critical thinking, a biblical foundation, hermeneutics, Bible study—I’m so grateful for Moody, what my professors poured into me, and what I learned from classmates from all over the world.”

The generosity of Moody partners is allowing students from all over the world to prepare for a life of service to God. Our latest campaigns for Giving Day, 48 Hours of Impact, and Launch a Leader each exceeded their fundraising goals, generating a combined \$1.6 million toward critically needed scholarships and donor-paid tuition for students at Moody Bible Institute and Moody Aviation.

Interest Soars in Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program

With the US in the midst of an unprecedented mental health epidemic, Clinical Mental Health Counseling (CMHC) has emerged as one of Moody Theological Seminary’s fastest-growing programs. Enrollment in CMHC increased from 76 students in 2020–21 to 99 in 2021–22 and has nearly doubled since 2016–17.

Like all of Moody’s programs, our seminaries in Chicago and Michigan teach clinical mental health counseling from a biblical perspective. They also operate counseling centers on their campuses that supply students with hands-on experience working with local clients. The result? Transformative Bible-based training that sends graduates into their field fully equipped to make an eternal difference in future clients’ lives.

“The main goal is understanding what clients really need,” MTS graduate Heather Marscheider says. “It’s to feed their mind but also their soul with the hope of Christ.”

Witness While You Work

As a new follower of Jesus Christ, Jacob Koleczek, an electrician from Tinley Park, Illinois, quickly developed an insatiable desire to study God’s Word and to communicate the gospel. When he found Moody Radio, it helped him grow in his understanding of Scripture and learn how to share his faith with wisdom, love, and confidence.

“I enjoy the messages I’m getting from Moody Radio so much that it’s on in my car all the time,” Jacob said. “I’m taught a lot of ways to say things I want to say to others who don’t know Christ but can never think of how to say them.”

I told him my story and the truth of Christ and gave a brief illustration of the gospel. He broke down in tears and gave me a hug right there. I gave him the Bible out of my car and told him to start reading the Gospel of John and Ephesians. He now considers me his best friend. He calls me for advice and explains how I’ve impacted his life.”

Reaching New Audiences through Podcasts

Moody Radio’s entry into podcasting continues to open new doors through life-changing biblical content. In spring 2022, *The Grandfather Effect* became the fastest-growing podcast in Moody Radio history. Told in a fresh storytelling format, the seven-episode series followed host and creator Brian Dahlen’s family and their emotional road from relational brokenness to reconciliation.

The podcast attracted a largely first-time audience to Moody Radio; 86 percent of its unique listeners were new to our on-demand programming.

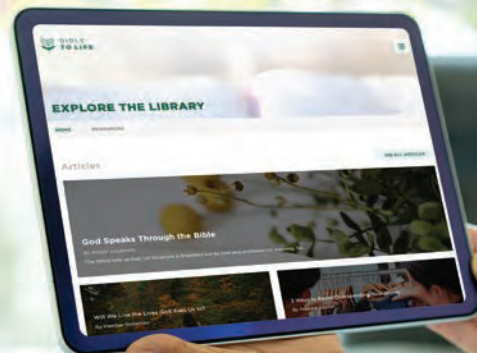

Saying Yes to Serving Ukrainians During War

My Yes Is on the Table uses the story of the Israelites' journey out of the wilderness and into the Promised Land to challenge readers to take a step of faith and put their "yes" on the table. Like the message of her new Moody Publishers book, author Jennifer Hand bravely said yes to God's call to serve in trauma care on a short-term mission trip to Ukraine in the middle of its war with Russia.

Emailing Moody Publishers from the heart of Ukraine, Jennifer wrote, "This has been the most stretching and heartbreaking 'yes' I have ever said yet. I have seen God in ways that I cannot even find words for."

Jennifer learned quickly how to apply her master's-degree training in trauma counseling and her vibrant faith in Christ in a war-torn nation. Shortly after

her missions group arrived in Ukraine, the Russian military attacked their host city with missiles. Jennifer and her team escaped unharmed despite driving for several hours in a war zone, accidentally breaching a military roadblock, and even being stuck in a broken elevator on the 16th floor of an apartment complex bombed days earlier.

"Later I made it back to base after getting to give away 30 bags of supplies and food," Jennifer recalled. "I got to hold lots of people while they sobbed and told me horrific stories about the war. I prayed with them and led two people to Christ. It was an unforgettable day."

SENT A reader recently shared a powerful story of how she received the Moody Publishers book *Sent: Living a Life that Invites Others to Jesus* at the ideal moment.

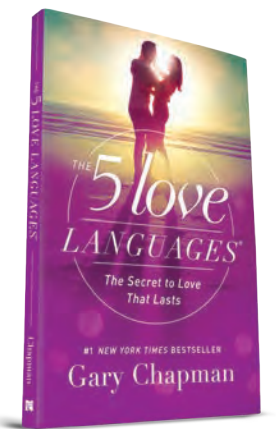

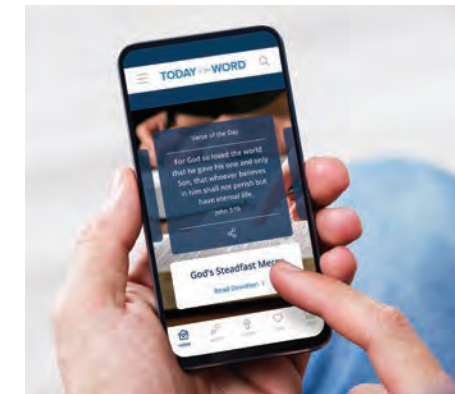

Shortly after John and Lisa were married in Oregon, John was arrested and sentenced to 10½ years in prison. But God brought hope to a seemingly hopeless situation and transformed John’s life and John and Lisa’s marriage.

Behind bars, John was handed a *Today in the Word* Bible study through the Set Free prison ministry. Each month, more than 6,500 inmates receive the devotional through partnering prison ministries. 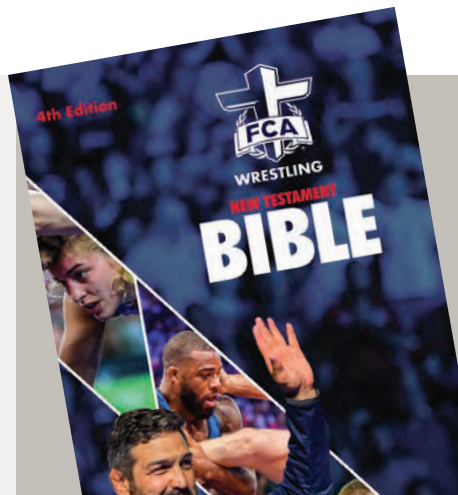

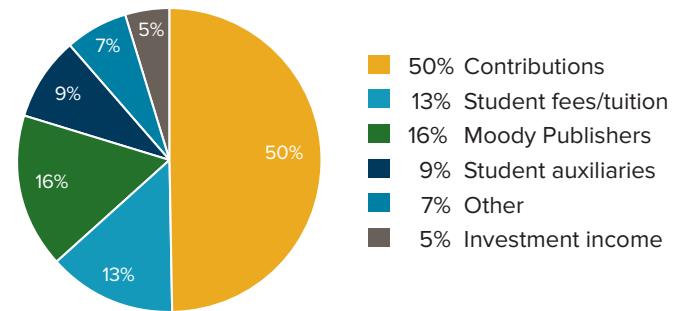

Even with the challenges and extra expenses associated with operating the school and media ministries during COVID, we are grateful to have ended the year with a positive cash flow.

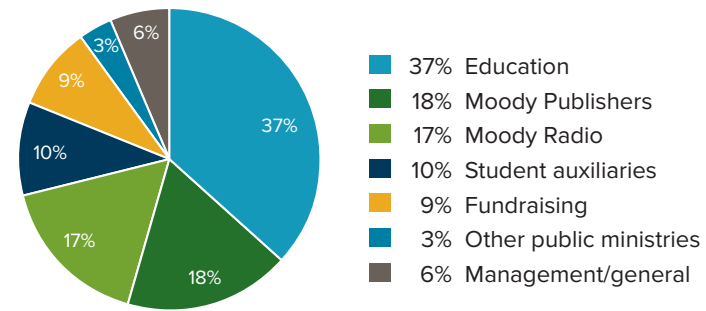

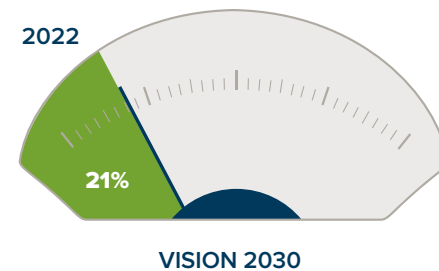
Vision 2030: Doubling Our Impact

When he was appointed Moody Bible Institute’s 10th president in 2019, Dr. Mark Jobe guided Moody’s leadership to implement Vision 2030. For the last three years, we have prayerfully sought God’s provision and blessing as we pursue His plan for our ministry.

Vision 2030 is a bold, ambitious commitment. We are asking God to give Moody a double portion of kingdom impact by 2030. Two years into Vision 2030, He is already moving through our ministries to reach more people with the good news of Christ than ever before. Nearly 2,000 pastors have been trained at Moody School of the Bible in Ghana to proclaim the gospel in their communities. Listeners across East Africa are discovering how to begin a personal relationship with

Christ through *Bold Steps* with Dr. Mark Jobe thanks to a partnership with Far East Broadcasting Company. *Today in the Word* is building more lives on a firm biblical foundation than ever in its 36-year history.

Campus Redevelopment Land Sales Helping Fund Vision 2030

An integral component to fulfilling Vision 2030 is the sale of some non-core sections of our campus real estate to help fund our growth plan. Our campus redevelopment initiative includes key strategies and planning for future infrastructure needs, in-class technologies, and investments that will grow our educational, broadcasting, and publishing ministries for greater kingdom impact.

This past year, Moody took notable steps forward in funding our Vision 2030 initiatives through the sale of three key properties. In December 2021 Moody closed on the first of several related real estate transactions for a total of \$98.1 million. In March 2022 Moody closed on a second transaction that generated approximately \$15 million. In May a third closing took place totaling \$30 million that raised our total revenue from campus redevelopment sales to roughly \$143 million.

The fourth and final phase of the planned development project will first require JDL, Moody’s partner, to provide a new athletic facility to eventually replace Moody’s Solheim Center. This new building will allow Moody to continue to provide facilities for athletics, intramural sports, fitness, and potentially mixed-use space for conferences and other student needs. Solheim will remain fully operational until the new facility opens.

We are deeply grateful for God’s ongoing provision toward Moody. We recognize our responsibility to be wise stewards of everything He has entrusted to us as we continue to focus on our 2030 vision of doubling Moody’s impact for Christ’s kingdom.
